## **6.004 Duties of the Purchasing Department.**

(6) Elect as an alternative to any provision in s. 120.57 (3) (c), F.S., protest to proceed with a solicitation or contract award process when it is set forth, in writing, that the particular facts and circumstances which demonstrate that the delay due to staying the solicitation or contract award process would be detrimental to the interests of the University. After the award of contract resulting from a competitive solicitation in which a timely protest was received and in which the University did not prevail, the contract will be canceled and re-awarded to the prevailing party unless the final order or settlement between the parties provides otherwise.
