MEETING MINUTES September 12, 2017

Chair Kelvin Lawson called the meeting to order. Attorney Barge-Miles called the roll and a quorum was established. The following trustees were present: Justin Bruno, Matthew Carter, Thomas Dortch, Bettye Grable, David Lawrence, Kelvin Lawson, Harold Mills, Kimberly Moore, Belvin Perry, Craig Reed, Nicole Washington, and Robert Woody.

Chair Lawson indicated that the Board had one action item, which was the president's employment agreement. He then recognized Trustee Dortch for a report from the Presidential Leadership Committee. Trustee Dortch shared that the committee met on September 7, 2017. The committee recommended to the Board that it extend the contract of interim president Dr. Larry Robinson for one-year, expiring September 14, 2018. Trustee Dortch then moved for approval of the extension of Dr. Robinson's contract for one-year. It was seconded by Trustee Woody. In response to a question, Chair Lawson clarified that this motion would not preclude the Board of Trustees from making a decision regarding the selection of the permanent president during that one-year period.
