#### **Enhance Student Support Services**

To ensure academic excellence, we will implement a legal writing laboratory, install a data management system, establish counseling services, and create health care and food services spaces at the law school that is currently located in a food desert.

The only shared college of engineering in the nation, we will foster a new model of human-centric engineering education integrated with HBCU traditions to train and graduate exceptional engineers with advanced degrees. We will drive real-world impact by pioneering multidisciplinary research and partnerships that address emerging societal needs and national priorities. Key Strategies:

- Enable research commercialization.
- Establish the Office for Technological Innovation.
- Recruit world-class faculty to drive new cross-disciplinary initiatives.
- Expand fellowship support for doctoral degree completion.

### Security Hardening

Security hardening funding would assist in the continuous efforts to protect the student body, faculty, staff, visitors, and campus. The goal is to enhance needed security infrastructure, including mass communication dispatching systems, safety programs and equipment, smart cameras, lighting, storage, cybersecurity, and hurricane shelter facility needs for state use.

Budget Timeline May | June

The Legislature enacts the General Appropriations Act (GAA) for the upcoming fiscal year. The Act identifies specific expenditures and revenue sources. Spending cannot exceed the revenue available for funding.

The Governor reviews the GAA and submits a veto message to the Legislature or Secretary of State within seven or 15 days.

Budget Timeline June

The Legislature could override any or all the vetoes submitted by the Governor.
