Florida Legislative Session | FY 2021-2022

SB 1028 | Charter Schools, Fairness in Women's Sports Act & Name, Image & Likeness

- Maintains July 1, 2021 effective date for NIL.
- Prohibits athletic teams designated for females, to be open to students of the male sex.
- Authorizes SUS and FCS to sponsor charter schools and revises reporting and accountability requirements and populations for which charter schools are authorized to limit the enrollment process.

Name, Image & Likeness

- Florida Legislature approved legislation in 2020 to implement NIL effective July 1, 2021.
- Financial literacy and healthcare post-graduation required.
- Legislature approved provision to prohibit Association dues from State funds in final days of 2021 Session.
- BOG regulation approved at June 22, 2021 meeting.
- On July 1, 2021, NCAA advised that student athletes could engage in NIL activities as legislated in their state of college attendance.
- Congressional action needed for uniform implementation of NIL policy.

FLORIDA A&M UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1887 as the State Normal College for Colored Students, Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University (FAMU) is the only historically state supported educational facility for African Americans in Florida. It has always been co-educational. In 1890, the second Morrill Act was passed. This enabled the school to become the Black Land Grant College for the State of Florida. In 1891, the college was moved from its original location west of town to its present location which was once the site of "Highwood," Territorial Governor W.P. Duval's slave plantation. The site is one of the highest hills in Tallahassee. The school was known as Florida A&M College from 1909 until 1953 when it attained university status.
