




FY 2024 Federal Budget Update

- Although Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 began October 1st, Congress has yet to approve its 12 appropriations bills to fund each agency of the federal government.
- A Continuing Resolution is currently funding the federal government at FY 2023 funding levels until November 17, 2023.
- The House has approved one bill and has nine awaiting floor consideration. The Senate Appropriations Committee has approved all 12 appropriations bills, but floor consideration has not yet been scheduled.
- We continue to advocate for priority federal programs of importance to FAMU at funding levels consistent with the President's budget request.



Goal One (1): Four-year Graduation Rate/Student Retention: Increase the University's four-year graduation rate (*PBF metric*) to 43%; increase second-year retention rate to 90.0%.
