NOTICE OF EMERGENCY AMENDMENT TO REGULATION

DATE: June 26, 2006

REGULATION CHAPTER TITLE: Administration

REGULATION TITLE AND NUMBER: Schedule of Tuition and Fees (3.017)

SUMMARY OF REGULATION: (EMERGENCY)STATEMENT OF FACTS AND REASONS FOR EMERGENCY REGULATION. The 2006 Florida Legislature has mandated a 3% increase in matriculation fees for undergraduate students for the 2006/2007 academic year. The emergency regulation is necessary in order to implement the legislated tuition increase and approved fee increases in time for students enrolling for Fall, 2006. In addition to complying with the legislative mandate, the emergency regulation also ensures that the amounts charged by the University for tuition and fees are appropriately adopted in regulation form as the ability to collect such has been relied in developing the University's budget. The ability to charge is vital to the fiscal welfare of the University; therefore, the University must proceed with the regulation authorizing such tuition and fees on an emergency basis.

STATEMENT OF REASONS THE PROCEDURE USED WAS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: The Proposed Emergency Regulation will be posted on the University website from until the Executive Meeting of Board of Trustees meeting after June 29, 2006. If approved by the Board of Trustees, the proposed emergency regulation will be an approved emergency regulation effective on July 17, 2006 for the Fall, 2006 and will be posted as such on the University Regulation website.

AUTHORITY FOR REGULATION: 1001.74(4),(10),(11), (24), (25); 1006.66(2),FS.; 2006-25 General Appropriations Act; Article IX, Florida Constitution, Board of Governors Regulation Development Procedures.

3.017 Schedule of Tuition and Fees.

(1) Tuition shall be defined as the basic fee charged to a student for instruction provided by the University. A charge for any other purpose shall not be included within this fee.

(a) Resident tuition and fees, comprised of the following, shall be defined as the fees charged an enrolled student who qualifies as a Florida resident as defined in Section 1009.21, F.S., and Rule 6C-7.005, F.A.C.:

1. Matriculation Fee;
2. Student Financial Aid Fee;
3. Capital Improvement Trust Fund Fee;
4. Building Fee;
5. Health Fee;
6. Athletic Fee; and - 833
7. Activity and Service Fee.

(b) Non-Resident tuition and fees, comprised of the following, shall be defined as the fees charged an enrolled student who does not qualify as a Florida resident as defined in Section 1009.21, F.S., and Rule 6C-7.005, F.A.C.:

1. Matriculation Fee;
2. Non-Resident Fee;
3. Student Financial Aid Fee;
4. Non-Resident Student Financial Aid Fee;
5. Capital Improvement Trust Fund Fee;
6. Building Fee;
7. Health Fee;
8. Athletic Fee; and
9. Activity and Service Fee.

(2) Registration shall be defined as consisting of two components:

(a) Formal selection of one or more credit courses approved and scheduled by the University; and

(b) Tuition and fee payment, partial or otherwise, or other appropriate arrangements for tuition and fee payment (deferment or third party billing) for the courses in which the student is enrolled as of the end of the drop/add period.

(3) Tuition and fee liability shall be defined as the liability for the payment of tuition and fees incurred at the point at which the student has completed registration, as defined above.

(4) The following tuition and fees shall be levied and collected effective Fall Semester 2004 for each student regularly enrolled, unless provided otherwise by law or in this chapter.

(a) Students will be assessed the following fees per credit hour:

(5) Pursuant to Section 1009.285, F.S., each student enrolled in the same undergraduate course for at least the third time shall be assessed an additional \$164.54 per credit hour.

(6) Pursuant to Section 1009.28, F.S., each student enrolled in the same college-preparatory course for at least the third time shall be assessed an additional \$200.65 per credit hour.
