

As part of America250FL @ FAMU and the 50th Anniversary of the Meek-Eaton Southeastern Regional Black Archives Research Center and Museum, this exhibition embodies the national commemoration's theme of "Service and Sacrifice" by illuminating the extraordinary military contributions of African Americans whose courage, intellect, and leadership have fortified both the nation and the ideals of democracy itself.

The Meek-Eaton Black Archives, Research Center, and Museum proudly presents a landmark curatorial project that draws upon the institution's unparalleled archival holdings to tell the stories of those who have defended freedom abroad while advancing equality at home. Service & Sacrifice: Military Legacies Preserved in the Vault features an extraordinary array of military uniforms, medals, correspondence, photographs, documents, and personal artifacts spanning more than a century of service—from the Civil War and World War II through Vietnam, Desert Storm, and the modern era. These rare and evocative objects reveal deeply personal narratives of Florida A&M University alumni, faculty, and Floridians whose patriotism and perseverance exemplify the enduring relationship between African American military service and the pursuit of full citizenship.

Through a lens of historical scholarship and cultural preservation, the exhibition explores how service in the armed forces became both a crucible of discipline and a catalyst for social change—transforming the lives of individuals and shaping collective movements toward civil rights, education, and leadership. Drawing on both institutional collections and community donations, *Service & Sacrifice* situates the African American soldier within the broader tapestry of American history, affirming that the defense of liberty has always included the fight for recognition, representation, and justice.

On view from February 1 through August 1, 2026, this exhibition coincides with the Meek-Eaton's 50th anniversary—MEBA50—a year-long celebration of the Archives' half-century of excellence in preserving, interpreting, and presenting African American history and culture. The presentation also stands as Florida A&M University's contribution to the America250 commemoration, reinforcing the University's legacy as a national leader in civic education, public service, and cultural preservation.

By bringing these artifacts out of the vault and into public dialogue, the Meek-Eaton Black Archives invites audiences to reflect on the intertwined narratives of patriotism and perseverance that define the African American experience. In doing so, Service & Sacrifice serves as both a tribute and a testament—honoring the bravery of those who served while inspiring future generations to uphold the same spirit of duty, scholarship, and freedom that has shaped the nation's ongoing journey toward a more perfect union.
